

Introduction to Project Muse

Project Muse provides full-text articles from hundreds of prestigious peer-reviewed journals published by university presses and scholarly societies. It is the result of a not-for-profit collaboration between participating publishers and the Milton S. Eisenhower Library at Johns Hopkins University. Unlike some of the commercial databases, Project Muse has no embargo on recent issues. And once loaded into the Project Muse database, content is permanent.

As of January 2012, Project Muse also includes thousands of electronic books from more than 65 university presses and scholarly publishers; while UCO does not have full-text online access to the books in Project Muse, the database can serve as a discovery tool, and Chambers Library can provide access through our print collection or Interlibrary Loan.

Though it's not covered in the tutorials, the search engine in Project Muse assumes an "and" Boolean operator between terms. To search for a phrase, such as the short story title "Young Goodman Brown," enclose the phrase in quotation marks.
