Downloading EBSCOHost E-books on your E-reader

1. Download the free Adobe Digital Editions software on the computer you will be using to manage your ebooks - www.adobe.com/products/digitaleditions/
2. Search the library catalog - library.uco.edu/catalog (limit your search to “ebooks”) or search the eBook Collection - library.uco.edu/d/?d=310
3. When you find a book you want, click “Download This eBook (offline).” Sign in to your EBSCOHost account or create a free account.
4. Choose 1 to 7 days for your checkout period. You may check it out again if no one else is waiting. You don’t have to turn it back in. It will quit working after the due date.

Reading the ebook on your computer (PC or Mac)

Open your Adobe Digital Editions software and click on the title of the book you downloaded.

Reading the ebook on your Kindle

1. Download and install Calibre on the computer you will use to manage your EPUB files - calibre-ebook.com
2. Select the EPUB files you want to convert and click “Convert books” in the top bar of Calibre
3. Select the conversion type – MOBI works well with Kindle
4. Send the book to your Kindle with “Connect/Share” or through a wired connection to the computer

Reading the ebook on your Nook or Sony Reader

1. Plug in your Nook or Sony Reader to your computer using the device USB connection cable
2. On your Adobe Digital Editions software, click on the Library link, then choose “Authorize Computer” (You will only have to do this the first time you use Adobe Digital Editions)
3. Your Nook or Sony Reader will appear as an icon on the left side bar
4. Drag the book you downloaded into the Nook or Sony Reader icon
5. Open your Nook or Sony Reader - your downloaded book will be in “My Documents”
