

The Library strives to provide access to well-maintained collections, information resources and equipment. The Library seeks to provide a safe and secure environment and facilities suitable for reading, studying and other activities associated with scholarly teaching and research.

Library Code of Conduct

Personal belongings and library laptops should not be left unattended. The Library will not be responsible for any loss or damages of personal belongings. Books and other materials left unattended may be removed by library staff and taken to the Circulation Desk.

Library staff will immediately call Campus Security if patrons engage in any illegal or unacceptable activities such as possession or use of alcoholic beverages, possession or use of illegal drugs or weapons, intentional damage or theft of library or others' personal property, or threats against library staff or patrons.

Viewing inappropriate websites, loud talking and other activities that impede reading, studying and other scholarly endeavors is not allowed. If such behavior continues after being warned by library staff, you will be asked to leave the library. If you do not leave, campus security will be notified.

You must exit the building when requested to leave during emergency situations or fire drills. Solicitation or distribution of materials is not allowed. You may post events and other materials on the bulletin board outside of the computer lab. University authorized materials can be displayed on the bulletin board by the south elevators on 1st floor.

Unplugging cables, wires, or making any adjustment to any library electronic equipment is prohibited.

Use of bicycles, skates, skateboards, scooters, etc. on premises is prohibited.

Running and/or climbing within the library or playing with artwork and/or displays is prohibited.

All portable items such as backpacks, bags, or briefcases may be subject to inspection by Library staff and/or campus security.

Animals are not permitted in the building, with the exception of those animals that provide assistance to people with disabilities.

Tampering with emergency mechanisms is prohibited (fire alarms, alarms in elevators, or opening emergency exits in non-emergency situations).

Defacing or damaging library materials including, but not limited to; underlining, highlighting, writing, using sticky notes or paper clips, removing pages or security devices is prohibited.

Inappropriate displays of affection are prohibited.
